OCT ROUTE and Expansion of Rice Industry

- ▶ 1990 -1996 production increased from 93,000 to 334,500 metric tons
- Exports increased from 51 metric tons in 1990 to 262,000 metric tons in 1996
- Europe accounted for almost 90% of exports

PL 480 – US Rice as Aid

- ▶ 1997 US Rice entered the Jamaican market
- Guyana's market share in Jamaica curtailed
- Added to the shock
